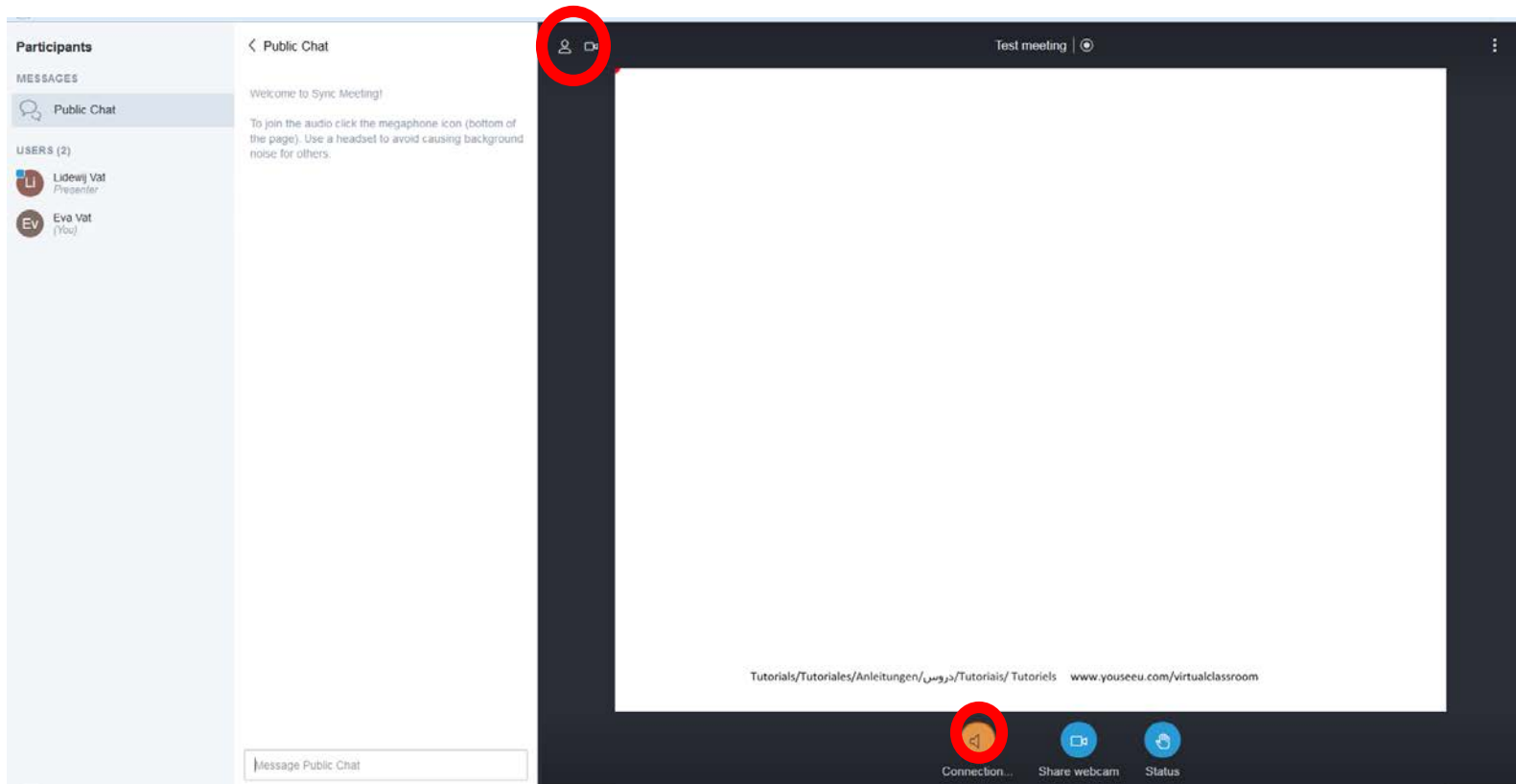

Strategy for Patient Oriented Research

A long-term CIHR research strategy to facilitate the growth of patient-oriented research in Canada

Launched Sept. 2011

Includes:

- Funding for research and trials
- Local support infrastructure
- National support infrastructure
- National research networks

POR Grant Competitions

This Fall, there were 8 POR grant competitions, or grants with a POR priority focus, including:

- Planning and Dissemination Grants (25 available)
- Project Grants (5 available for POR)
- POR Catalyst Grants (35 available)

POR Grant Competitions

Ongoing competitions include:

- POR Impact Assessment Grants (closes **Oct. 22!**)
- POR Awards – Transition to Leadership (closes **Nov. 14**)
- National Training Entity (LOI closes **Dec. 10**)
- SPOR SUPPORT Unit (Phase II)

POR Grant-Crafting Tips

Start before you start!

Begin building relationships before you begin writing

The most successful POR partnerships start before a research question is even determined

POR Grant-Crafting Tips

Show me the money

Patient Engagement and Knowledge Translation can include activities you may not have built into a budget before

Make sure you account for them when you're writing your application

POR Grant-Crafting Tips!

Patient-oriented research:

- Engages patients as partners
- Takes on patient priorities
- Impacts patients directly

Engages

What is your plan to engage patients?

Why do you need to involve patients?

How involved are they in your team?

Are they empowered to make decisions?

Prioritizes

Why is this important to patients?

- Have you asked any?
- Have you contacted the right patient organizations?

Are you addressing a priority somebody else in NL identified?

Impacts

- Who are your Knowledge Users?
 - Who will be using the results of your research and how?
 - How will you get this information to them?
- Do you have buy-in from them?
- How are they going to drive change?
